


COPENHAGEN – FACTS AND NUMBERS

POPULATION 2000-2014 (AND PROJECTION 2015-2025)




CITY OF COPENHAGEN/

COUNCIL AND COMMITTEES



The City Council is the supreme political authority in the municipality of Copenhagen

- 55 members elected for a four year term
- The Lord Mayor head of the City Council
- The City Council is made up of seven committees which are:

The Finance Committee The Culture and Leisure Committee **The Children and Youth Committee** The Health and Care Committee The Social Services Committee The Technical and Environmental Committee The Employment and Integration Committee

The Committees take care of the immediate administration of tasks within their field of responsibility. Overall decisions are made by the City Council as a whole.

Each Committee is served by a department.

The Child and Youth Administration has about 70,000 users and more than 17,000 employees and it is the largest Department in the City of Copenhagen.

Annual budget of 10 billion kroner, approx. 1,3 billion Euro



- Legislation coved by the presentation from the ministry
- Parents can apply for day-care on odd hours, if they have documented need, work related.
- Parents with documented need are given priority to the day-care centers with odd hours opening.



- 24-hours day care centres
 - "Vartov" and "Haraldsgården"
 - "Vartov" accommodates 22 children aged 0-2, and 46 children aged 3-5
 - "Haraldsgården" accommodates 50 children aged 0-2, and 70 children aged 3-5
 - "Haraldsgården" opened as 24-hours center in august 2015



- Weekend open Day-care centers
 - 3 day-care centers are open during normal hours in the weekend
 - Scaled down from 6 to 3 in 2016, due to low demand

- Extended opening hours on weekdays
 - 42 day-care centers have extended opening hours (above 55 hours per week)
 - Their opening hours are before 7 am and after 5 pm.
 - No restrictions on applying for place in day-care center with extended hours



- Payment from parents
 - 0-2 years 3.454 / 2.844 per month (approx. 460 / 380 €)
 - 3-5 years 2.551 / 1.912 per month (approx. 340 / 255 €)
 - Weekend supplementary charge
 - 0-2 years 150 kr. per day (approx. 20 €)
 - 3-5 years 114 kr. per day (approx. 15 €)
 - 24-hours supplementary charge per month: 340 kr. (approx. 45 €)
 - Supplementary charge per night used: 89 kr. (approx. 12 €)
 - Monthly payment maximum: 848 kr. (approx. 113 €)
